


PLAYWRIGHT STATEMENT



Back in 2006, feeling like I was on the outside of the art form of theater I was studying while in undergrad, I set out to write a play that I could be a part of. A contemporary story where I felt like the characters spoke and looked like me, and the men of the communities I come from. I also wanted to create this piece for a few of my peers who felt the same. I wanted to showcase the spectrum of the black man outside of the stereotypical monolithic portrayals I saw throughout my life.

So, I started assembling what I thought were my best poems at the time and put them in narrative form. I was a SLAM poet trying to figure out what it meant to be a playwright. I called that play *Thoughts of a Colored Man on a Day When the Sun Set Too Early*. Who thought that idea I started to create in my small dorm room so many years later would blossom into a Broadway play. Then to have young black men around the country in the same position I was as an undergrad now do that play. Saying I am blessed would be an understatement. I am truly grateful for *Thoughts of a Colored Man* to be here at the University of Missouri.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

For non-Black folks: Hi. Glad you could make it.

For the Black folks: This is for you.

For the times you were denied a seat at the table. For the times you were given a chair at the table and realized you would rather lift every chair and swing instead of sitting down. For the times you didn't want to fix your face. For the times you sat with fires inside and said "it's fine."

For Black children and Black childhoods.

For your relentless hope.

For the culture. For the cookout. For the bad Spades partner. For the electric slides into the future. For the future you stay fighting to be a part of. For the times you had to modulate your voice to the key of white supremacy. For the Affirmative Action that benefited you and your children but not your children's children. For the times our successes were met with violence.

For the firsts and for the only's. For the loopholes of the 13th amendment.

For 2023 and for 1923. For Keenan Scott II and James T. Scott.

We see you. We center you. We uplift you. We honor you.

By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.


